



Many cleaning products are made of dangerous chemicals.




Don't pick or eat anything from a plant, no matter how good it smells or looks.

- Save the Poison Center phone number in your phone: 1-800-222-1222.
- Teach everyone in your house how to call the Poison Center.
- Take a walk with your child around your home and see if together you can find places where poisons may be hiding.
- Lock away items that you think may not be safe for your child.



- · Check for bee and wasps nests and ant mounds often.
- Clean up any piles that could attract snakes and or spiders that may be unsafe.
- Keep grass cut low so that animals that can sting or bite you cannot hide there.

bathroom

- Throw away old or expired medications. Call your local poison center at 1-800-222-1222 to find out safe ways to throw out medications.
- Keep medicines in containers they came in.
- · Lock away items that are unsafe for children. Some unsafe items could be soaps. make-up, mail cleaners and nail polish.

garage

- We keep many unsafe items in the garage. Teach your child that they should only go in the garage with an adult.
- Make sure to keep all items vou feel may be unsafe locked away from your children.
- Unsafe items could include gas, pesticides, fertilizer, pain, etc.

laundry

- Lock away items that could be unsafe for your children. Some unsafe items could be cleaners. bleach and soap.
- Keep laundry products in containers they came in.



- Beer and wine can be dangerous to small children. Keep open drinks in your hand or away from your child's reach.
- Keep all cigarettes and items containing nicotine (the chemical in cigarettes) out of reach of your child. Nicotine can make your child very sick.







In case of a possible poisoning

If you think that a child may have gotten into an item that is unsafe, ALWAYS:

- Take the child away from the item or room.
- Try to see what the product is.

After the emergency actions, call 1-800-222-1222.

- kitchen Lock away items that could be unsafe for your children such as
 - Place all medicines out of sight and out of reach of your children.

cleaners and soaps.

- Put in child safety latches/locks on all drawers or cabinets where you keep cleaners and other chemicals.
- Keep all of your food away from cleaners and other chemicals.
