Poison Prevention Program

Grades K-2

Objectives: After participation in the poison prevention program, the students in Grades K-2 should be able to:

1. Define what a poison is.
2. State the four routes of poisoning.
3. Describe three poison prevention safety measures.
4. Explain why to ask an adult first before touching, tasting or smelling something.
5. Explain why they must only take medicine with a trusted adult.

Time required: Approximately 60 minutes
