Parents of young children most often call about medicine, personal care products (cosmetics, hair products) and household cleaners.

Using Mr. Yuk stickers can help them stay away from dangerous items. Put Mr. Yuk stickers on items, like cleaning products, that could cause harm. Explain items with a Mr. Yuk sticker should not be eaten, smelled or touched.

Good Practices

- Keep personal care products and household cleaners in their original containers with labels on. Do not transfer to new containers.
- Do not mix cleaning products together.
- Review and get rid of unused or expired medicines.
- Have open family discussions about the importance of medicine safety. Talk to teens about the dangers of taking medicine that isn't theirs.

Safe Storage

Safely storing hazardous items in your home can greatly reduce poisoning risk. To ensure safe storage:

- Keep items stored up high and out of reach and sight of children.
- Choose safe storage areas and keep products organized and clearly marked.
- Consider medicine lock boxes or child safety locks if your household includes young children.
- Ask visitors to keep their medicines stored safely and out of reach.
